
Printing Your Barcodes

The printed quality of your barcode is very important. Please print a page of three or four test tags to see how they look. Use a critical eye when checking the quality of the barcodes.

If your barcodes look like this, you're good to go.



If it looks like one of the barcodes below, realign your print cartridge and try again. (Print tags using the normal setting, not high quality – ink will be too dark.)





If it looks like this, replace your ink cartridge and align the new one.



Other options for printing tags:

Small cost involved:

Upload a pdf copy of your tags to Office Max or another local printer.

Print tags at Marion Public Library.

Free:

Check with someone who has a laser printer. This type of printer is your best option.
